Thanks also to Peter McInnes for your ongoing commitment to produce Te Pukapuka over the last 10 years and enjoy your well-earned rest. I have really enjoyed the last 6 years as National Guildmaster and hope you give full support to my replacement.

LOCAL SCOUT GUIDE FELLOWSHIP REPORT: At present we have 6 Fellowship Groups spread from Northland to Canterbury. These groups operate just like most other Guilds as they continue to uphold the ideas in their communities. They organise themselves, value their independence and meet regularly. Day trips potluck meals and the obligatory coffee mornings, round out their varied programmes. Regular newsletters keep them up to date. A closer look at LSGF membership makes for interesting reading:

- Over 60% of members are from Trefoil Guilds which have closed.
- A further 20+% are dual members who still belong to a Trefoil Guild or Baden-Powell Guild.
- 98% are women most with some Trefoil or Guiding connection.

While we are more than happy to provide an alternative home for Guilds that have closed, we are also aware that there are former members who have moved to areas where there is no Guild activity. We are currently offering Lone Fellowship membership so that we don't lose valued members. All this begs the question "Where to from here?" Numbers continue to dwindle and none of us is getting any younger. Perhaps instead of operating as 3 separate groups, the time has come to seriously consider becoming one NZSGF, like almost every other ISGF member country.

Unfortunately, New Zealand has not sent a representative to any of the meetings or gatherings that were face to face – Malaysia, India or Sri Lanka.

AsPac are very keen to help those less fortunate than ourselves and carry out numerous projects in the communities in which they live.

Recently, Simon Rhee from South Korea, has made badges, pins and patches, free of charge, for all member countries to present at an event where recruitment can be promoted, and all participants can wear with pride. These have been sent to New Zealand but, unfortunately, are sitting in customs awaiting clearance, so will be sent out separately following the Conference.

ISGF REPORT: Created in 1953 and supported by WOSM and WAGGGS, ISGF has National Scout and Guide Fellowships in **75 countries** and more to follow. Furthermore, it is also represented in **34 countries** with members (individuals or groups) of Central Branch.

The 30th ISGF World Conference will be going ahead and will be held in Granada, Spain from Tue, 17 September 2024 - Sun, 22 September 2024. If anyone is interested in attending, the details are on the ISGF website.

There will be pre-Conference tours and post-Conference tours available, but get in quickly with registration because the longer you leave it the more expensive it becomes.

There has been also correspondence relating to the World Conference, so please to check out what is happening in our world of ISGF please check the website frequently.


