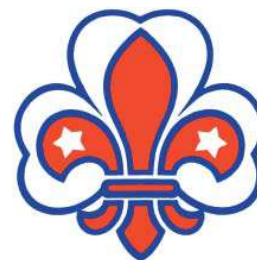

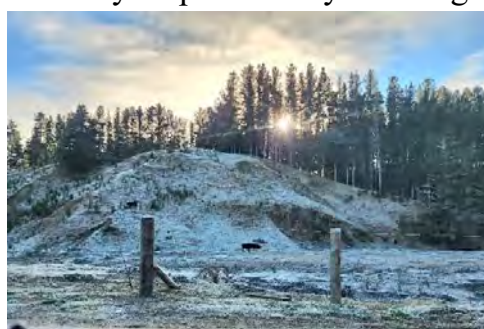

July already, where has the year gone.??

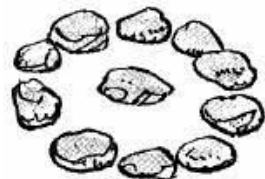

Part of an article regarding the National Scout Museum called 'Remembering our Alumni' featuring Valerie Henwood.

Doug Collins former member and Canterbury Scout Museum design and display coordinator, who now lives in the Marlborough Sounds, wrote to us about the founding of the museum. From that we learned one of those young Cub Leaders was Valerie Henwood who now lives in a Retirement Village in Christchurch.

At the moment the Scout Museum has its large collection of Scout memorabilia in temporary storage in Christchurch, pending a decision on how to best use the collection for the benefit of Scouting. We understand that significant volumes of historic information still arrive each week from Groups throughout the country who want their records stored and made available for research by future generations of Scouts.

We thank all the Museum Committee members for their efforts over the last 34 years and wish Valerie Henwood, their founding chairperson, all the best.

Auckland Branch Report

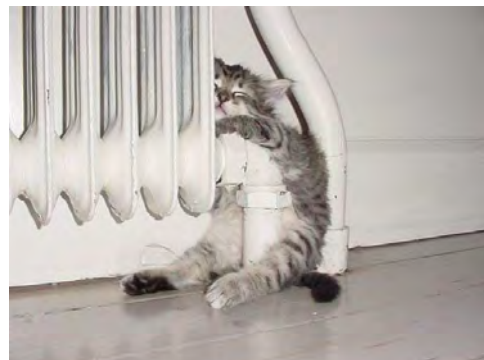

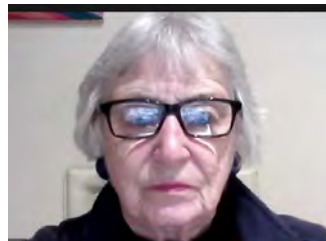

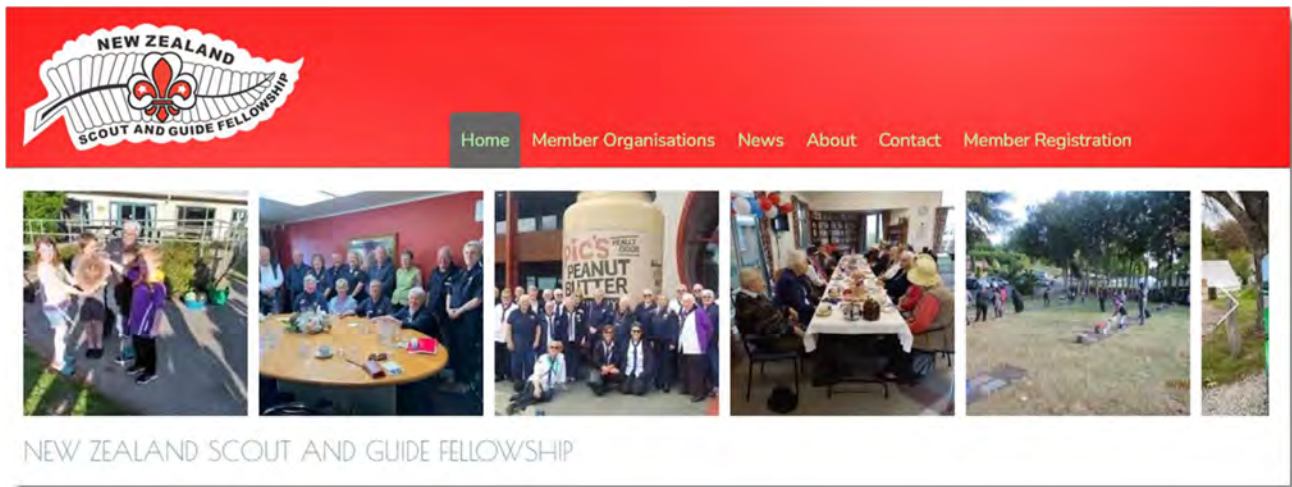

If someone completes an Expression of Interest or a Member registration, these are emailed to info@nzsgf.org.nz.

We manage this email account and will distribute any enquiry or registration to our nearest branch. Those registering can choose an organisation or leave it for us to just pick the closest.

This site is a great site to reference in your promotional material and will appeal to the more technically inclined prospective members.

What to do if we send you an inquiry or a Member Registration?

Respond quickly. People who do things online expect a prompt response.

We will copy them in on our email to you, so they get your contact details.

If they have questions, get in contact and answer.

If they have completed a **Member Registration**, then they have already supplied you with everything you need to set them up as a member. PLEASE DO NOT SEND ANOTHER FORM FOR THEM TO FILL OUT as this is not needed.

Send them a welcome message, give them a call, have a chat.

Do NOT reject them if you think they are too young, let us know and we will direct them elsewhere or encourage them to setup a new Branch.

DISCUSSION PAPER – PROPOSED MERGER OF THE B-P GUILD, TREFOIL GUILD, LOCAL SCOUT & GUIDE FELLOWSHIP GROUPS AND THE NEW ZEALAND SCOUT & GUIDE FELLOWSHIP

At the last National B-P Guild AGM held in Tauranga a sub committee was formed to look at the possibility of merging the Baden-Powell Guilds, the Trefoil Guilds and the Local NZSGF Groups into one organisation. The members of the sub-committee elected to put together the draft discussion paper are Gary Froggatt, current National council deputy chair, Helen Mitchell-Timaru, Steve Hurley-Auckland, Scott Tingey-Wellington.

Background

For some time now there has been discussion that having three sections feeding into the New Zealand Scout and Guide Fellowship (which in turn is a member of the International Scout and Guide Fellowship) is unwieldy. The terms we use are somewhat out of date and leads to a barrier to recruiting new members. Having 3 sections also means that is difficult to set up a single web presence. To be able to do this would be significantly more beneficial to recruitment and less confusing if we only had to promote just the NZ Scout & Guide Fellowship.

Some home truths

Membership is literally dying off and we need to inject new membership. The leaders who have come behind us in Scouting and Guiding are more technologically connected. Right now, we have no where they can find us on the web.

- A Google search for NZ Scout and Guide Fellowship finds an ISGF page but no details about the NZ organisation.
- A similar search for NZ B-P Guild finds a Christchurch Community Organisation listing for B-P Guild Christchurch and Wanganui B-P Guild. But again no welcoming details.
- NZ Trefoil Guild finds Girlguiding NZ Alumnae page which does list the Trefoil Guild.
- At the recent Jamboree Steve & Vicki Hurley spoke to over 30 leaders about the fellowship and B-P Guild. Many were coming to the end of their active scouting careers. Some had not heard of either organisations. This from leaders who were in the main over 60.

What the merged organisation will look like

At local branch level, nothing needs to change. Local identity could remain as they are now. An option could be for the Auckland Baden-Powell Guild to change to the Auckland Scout & Guide Fellowship. The Christchurch Trefoil Guild could change to the Christchurch Scout & Guide Fellowship and the Te Awamutu Local Scout & Guide Fellowship would just drop the word local.

All your branch programmes would remain the same, your activities would remain the same, your officers would remain the same and your finances would continue to remain under your direct control. NZSGF is not directly part of Scouts NZ and so are not subject to any financial control. However, Trefoil Guilds are currently under the control of Girl Guiding NZ both for administration and financially. The current centralised Scouts NZ or Girl Guides NZ structure or any future re-structure of their financial management cannot affect us.

Representation (National Council)

Current rules provide for 2 P-B Guild, 2 Trefoil Guild, 2 LSGF & 3 Ex-Officio members. Re-organization of the national council to be discussed further.

Possible Regional Structure who in turn could elect a NZSGF executive council.

Further discussion re national meetings and gatherings would be required.

There will be some minor constitutional changes required.

Advantages/Benefits

- One Fellowship with many branches rather than multiple organisations each with multiple branches.

- Single website presence – much easier to direct members and prospective members to one Facebook page and one website.
- Research and feedback indicates the one organisation will appeal to current older leaders and former leaders more than 3 sections.
- Multiple centralized reported activities present a much more active and inviting picture.
- More opportunity for both genders to join and participate.
- One national organisation with a continuing link to both Scouts NZ and Guides NZ
- Better chance of fuller representation and a more inclusive position with both organisations
- As new younger members join the NZSGF, we will be able to provide more support we previously used to provide to both Scouting NZ and Guiding NZ.
- The formation of a single national NZSGF will bring us more in line with the majority of current member countries belonging to the International Scout & Guide Fellowship.

Next Steps

Step 1: Discuss this proposal at the 3 Triennial AGMs - **completed**

Step 2: Vote on resolution for agreement in principle (Details below) - **completed**

Step 3: If agreed send this paper to all member branches - **completed**

Step 4: Discuss this paper within your branches - **progressing**

Step 5: Branches to return their vote by email or by NZ Post by **30 September 2024**

Motion tabled, amended as below and adopted by majority decision.

THAT THE REPORT ON THE PROPOSAL TO MERGE THE NZ BADEN-POWELL GUILD, THE LOCAL SCOUT & GUIDE FELLOWSHIP GROUPS AND THE NZ TREFOIL GUILDS INTO THE NEW ZEALAND SCOUT & GUIDE FELLOWSHIP BE RECEIVED AND ENDORCED IN PRINCIPLE, THAT THE REPORT & MOTION BE FORWARDED TO ALL GUILDS FOR DISCUSSION WITH A RECOMMENDATION FOR ADOPTION BY SIMPLE MAJORITY AND THAT BRANCHES VOTE BY THE 30TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER 2024.

Question and Answer Sheet to accompany proposed Merger Documents

What are the main benefits to becoming one organization?

- One Fellowship with many branches rather than multiple organisations each with multiple branches.
- Single website presence – much easier to direct members and prospective members to one website and one Facebook page.
- Research and feedback indicates the one organisation will appeal to current leaders and former leaders more than 3 sections.

- Multiple centralized reported activities present a much more active and inviting picture.
- More opportunity for former Scout or Guide leaders to join and participate.
- One national organisation with a continuing link to both Scouts NZ and Girl Guiding NZ
- Better opportunity to promote fuller representation and a more inclusive position with both organisations
- As new younger members join the NZSGF, we will be able to provide more support we previously used to provide to both Scouting NZ and Girl Guiding NZ.
- The formation of a single national NZSGF will bring us more in line with the majority of current member countries belonging to the International Scout & Guide Fellowship.

Will there be any changes to fees?

- No. There will only be one stream for fee payments & census returns for all Branches
- Current process: member pays Branch, Branch pays National B-P Guild or Girl Guiding NZ, National B-P Guild and Girl Guiding NZ pays NZSGF and NZSGF pays ISGF
- New Process: member pays Branch, Branch pays NZSGF, NZSGF pays ISGF. ISGF Fees are currently Euro 2.51 or approx NZ\$4.50 per member
NZSGF Travel levy is currently \$3.00 per member.

Do NZSGF members pay WOSM and WAGGGS fees?

- No, these fees are paid directly by Girl Guiding NZ and Scouts NZ to parent bodies.

Will there be changes to uniform and/or scarves?

- There will be no immediate change at local level, but eventually change to NZSGF scarf.
- There is no proposal to change current uniforms.
- (Currently B-P Guild has navy or white; Trefoil Guild has red or navy)
- NZSGF does not currently have a uniform and committee members previously wore ISGF scarf, until the NZSGF Scarf was adopted in 2022. Both long scarf and triangular scarfs are still available.
- Further discussion and agreement can be made at a later date about uniform choices.

Will there be any changes of program and processes at Branch/Group level?

- No, all your current and future programs & activities will continue to be decided by you
- All your Branch officers will continue to be elected by your own members.

- All your finances would be retained and controlled by your branch.

Will there be any name changes at Branch level?

- No. Unless your Guild wants to make a change to your existing name.
- Your current name can remain the same should your Guild so decide.
- However, the recommended change would be to replace the words Baden-Powell Guild or Trefoil Guild to become XYZ Scout and Guide Fellowship.
- As an example: Tauranga Trefoil Guild could become Tauranga Scout and Guide Fellowship or Tauranga Trefoil Fellowship.
- Where there are 2 Branches with the same name they could be: Murihiku Scout and Guide Fellowship and Murihiku Trefoil Fellowship.

Will publications continue as before?

- There will be no change to E-link and Te Pukapuka in the immediate future.
- Communication is our best way to stay informed and up-to-date within our organization.
- Both publications can be linked to the website.

Will Trefoil Branches still be able to be linked to Girl Guiding NZ?

- Absolutely.
- Trefoil guilds can continue to have full liaison, links, and membership with GirlGuiding NZ.
- There will be no change to existing Guiding relationships.
- Twinning and overseas contacts will be encouraged to continue as at present.

How did this proposal to merge come about?

- See the discussion paper which is attached to these documents.
- The proposal was on the agenda of the Christchurch NZSGF Triennial conference.
- A motion to send the proposal to B-P, Trefoil and LSGF Branches for discussion and vote was carried by majority vote at the NZSGF meeting.

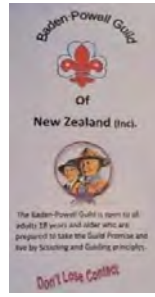
