Minutes of the 2023 AGM:

The previous Minutes were published in the Te Pukapuka as well as in the Booklet so I will take it that you all read them. Moved as a true copy Warwick Bruce, Seconded Peter McInnes.

Matters Arising:

Jo Read, Christchurch Branch – Did the CEO reply to her letter in 2023? Answer: yes and the reply was recorded in the 2023 Minutes and also a copy was sent to her.

National Guildmaster's Annual Report:

As published in the AGM Booklet. Moved by Lesley Bowers and seconded by Gary Froggatt

National Patron's Report:

As published in the AGM Booklet.

Te Pukapuka report:

Peter McInnes gave his last Report as published in the AGM Booklet. Joan McInnes was asked to join our meeting for a presentation to her and Peter for their good work over the last 10 years.

Nominations for people interested in taking the job on were opened. Steve Hurley said David Thorpe from Auckland is prepared to take it on as a combined newsletter when/if we combine in the future. (The merger will be discussed further on in the Agenda.)

Lesley Bowers is happy to take it over in the interim until such time.

It was moved that these options be accepted by Margaret Blair-Young and seconded by Sally Cole. Carried.

Financial Report:

A report was given by the Treasurer. It was moved that the Financial Report be accepted by Bet Wilson and seconded by Graham Johnson.

Trading Post 2023 and Forecast Budget 2024 was produced in the booklet. The budget is getting very difficult to project with all the stops and starts that Covid-19 and adverse weather has presented.

Election of National Guildmaster:

Gary Froggatt took over the Chair and reported that Lesley Bowers has completed her six years as National Guildmaster and as laid out in the Constitution is not able to do another term. No nominations have been received to date and none were forthcoming from the floor. The present Guildmaster can therefore stand for a further finite period – 3 months. A discussion then followed led by Jo Read, Christchurch Branch, who gave her opinion of what happened in the past and registered her objection to Lesley Bowers continuing and according to her we would have to change the Constitution. Sally Cole, Murihiku Branch, asked if we could go "outside the border" and "do" the 3 months and then vote Lesley Bowers in for a further 3 years. Comment from Paul van Herpt – the Constitution will need to be changed by the end of the year as stated by the Incorporated Societies Act 2022 which has been updated.

Gary Froggatt, Auckland Branch, moved: *That Lesley Bowers be asked to continue for a further period or until another Guildmaster can take on the role*. Graham Johnson, Little John Branch, seconded the proposal. Jo Read, Christchurch Branch, asked that the motion be amended to state that it was only for 3 months. Only 6 were in favour of this amendment, so the amendment failed. Original motion was carried.

Jo Read, Christchurch Branch, asked if the Incorporated Societies will be told of the changes against the Constitution. Yes, this will be carried out. This will also be talked about tomorrow at the NZSGF Triennial meeting.

Lesley Bowers will take over for 3 months and then a meeting will be held by Zoom when it will be stressed that the Constitution will be updated as well.

Margret Blair-Young was confirmed as the National Patron for a further term. Gary Froggatt moved that nominations be closed.

National Council of the New Zealand Scout and Guide Fellowship representatives. This is made up of two Baden-Powell Guild members, two Trefoil Guild members, two LSGF members and three Ex-Officio members. Gary Froggatt nominated Steve Hurley, Auckland Branch, and Gary also is willing to continue as well. Steve Hurley accepted the position. Thanks to Margaret McKibbin, Little John Branch, the retiring representative, for her attendance to date since 2022.

Venue for 2025 AGM:

Gary Froggatt suggested that the next AGM be held in Wellington in an effort to get a Branch there. Lesley Bowers suggested that we do it by Zoom every 2nd year and the alternate year face to face. As well as the Triennial every 3rd year. Other suggestions were also made. Gary suggested we ask our Zoom attendees – Greg Davies from Australia said that their annual meetings are

held in person but in between they Zoom. The in-person AGM are held in the big cities around Australia. He strongly recommended we continue with the in-person if possible for the Fellowship which you don't have on Zoom. Mariyam Shakeela, who joined us on Zoom and travels around the world a lot as the AsPac Committee Chair (and in London at the moment), recommends the face-to-face meetings as much as possible.

We will have to come back to this later in the year. No planning has been done at the moment for Wellington.

Action Plan 2022-2025:

Produced In the back of the AGM booklet once again. A good way to grow your Guild. Put in each year in the hopes that people will read and act on it.

Scouts NZ Update:

Gary Froggatt wrote to the National CEO to provide a report of 2023 activities of Scouts NZ for this meeting. Unfortunately the National Scouts AGM meeting in Auckland this weekend so no report received. Last year only three people from Auckland attended; Gary and Carolyn Froggatt and Lesley Anderson.

Scout Youth Foundation:

Similar to the above. Gary contacted SYF but got no reply. \$1.1m in for Scout Youth Foundation. Steve Hurley, Auckland Branch, contacted Warwick Bell (the SYF Secretary) because they wanted to know where Auckland Branch's contributions were going and he did hear back but only with the previous year's reports.

General Business:

Asia Pacific Region Badges: We have received some badges to give away to every member this weekend from the AsPac representative from South Korea. He has sent them by courier but unfortunately, they did not arrive in time. Lesley wants every postal addresses of the Branches and she will post to them enough badges and pins for each member attending this AGM. (Mary Crane provided these)

Discussion Papers:

Two papers were included in the AGM Booklet.

No 1: **Proposed Merger Discussion Paper**: Gary spoke to the merger proposal. The Discussion Paper was a result of the 2023 AGM in Tauranga, and written by Gary Froggatt, Helen Mitchell, Steve Hurley, and Scott Tingey.

Following the presentation, it was opened to the floor for discussion on the Motion below: Current uniforms, present finances and programmes will not change and each 'group' will be staying within their separate entities, it is the title that will initially change and all be under the umbrella of the NZSGF. This means, as one entity it is clearer and easier to explain what we stand for and

our purpose. All 'groups' will end their Branch name with Scout and Guide Fellowship e.g. Rosetown Ramblers Scout and Guide Fellowship.

Greg Davies said that in Australia they have had had problems and have restructured. They have evolved. SGFA role is a conduit of information between the world and Australia – not to interfere with separate branches. Their dress – not uniform – is kept simple – a T-shirt with a logo. We need to look forward to attracting the younger people like they are in Australia – 25-35 age group.

Steve Hurley spoke about the Alumni which Guides and Scouts have as an alternative to Baden-Powell and Trefoil Guilds as well as Scouting Associates. We need to do something before they get our future or more possible members.

Motion: That the Report on the proposal to merge the NZ Baden-Powell Guild, the Local Scout & Guide Fellowship Groups and the NZ Trefoil Guild into the NZ Scout & Guide Fellowship be received and endorsed in principle, that the Report & Motion be forwarded to all Guilds for discussion with a recommendation for adoption by simple majority and that branches vote by the 30th day of June 2024.

Motion put by Gary Froggatt, seconded by Sheryl Phillips.

A vote was taken for individuals present. The 30th June vote will be one vote per Branch.

Results of those attending were: 22 for, 1 against, 2 abstained. In principle we go ahead with this.

No 2: A further letter from Christchurch Branch re the National Scout Museum

Before going ahead with this discussion Paul van Herpt was invited to come forward and present his slide show about the Museum. This was extremely interesting, very impressive and was well presented. It showed that many hours of work had been carried out, over the years, with Scouts NZ to relocate the National Scout Museum to a permanent home. No solution has yet been agreed on. It answered most questions that people had about the Museum.

Gary Froggatt suggested that we pass a motion that the Guild give their support that the National Scout Museum should continue. Carried

Jo Read, Christchurch Branch, gave her comments and asked questions about the slide show that Paul van Herpt gave.

Further discussion will continue tomorrow at the Triennial meeting.

Lesley gave a gift to Paul to thank him for his presentation which was very good and very interesting.

As we had to vacate the Conference Room so it could be set up for our dinner in the evening the meeting closed at 4.00 pm.

Post Script:

After a very enjoyable dinner a certificate was presented to Peter McInnes. Lesley Bowers then showed a presentation on the NZSGF and how it was formed, connections to the ISGF etc. It was very informative and certainly explained inter-relationships – helpful in preparing for the discussion to be held at the Triennial Meeting in the morning.

Paul van Herpt re-presented his presentation on the National Scout Museum for the attendees who were not at the Baden-Powell Guild AGM.

Jo Read (No 220) was presented with the Award for being the longest member present at the AGM – 50 years. This was received with acclamation.

* Please Note: At the Triennial Meeting on 16th March 2024, the Merger Discussion Paper was presented and the following amendment was voted on: and that branches vote by the 30th day of September". This was accepted.
